BASICS OF LIVING

Colonists needed all kinds of basic amenities: houses, food, and farmland.

EXTERNAL THREATS

Colonists quarreled among themselves, lacked practical skills, looked for quick wealth, and refused to work (those who were from the nobility) or grew angry and resentful (those who bore the brunt of the work).
