<p>Who was William Penn? <i>Penn was an Englishman, the son of a navy admiral who was on friendly terms with King Charles II. Penn became a Quaker.</i></p> <p>Who, other than the Quakers, settled in Penn's colony? List at least two groups. Any two of these would be correct:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Protestants from Germany, Holland, and Sweden</li> <li>Presbyterians from Scotland and Ireland</li> <li>Pietists from eastern Europe</li> <li>Large groups of Moravians, Amish, and Mennonites</li> </ul>	<p>What were the key beliefs of the early Quakers? List at least two. <i>Any two of these would be correct:</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Emphasized inward spiritual experience</li> <li>Developed radical forms of worship stemming from convictions that ordinary people can hear from God without needing a pastor's guidance</li> <li>Believed all are equal before God</li> <li>Were pacifists and refused to engage in self or national defense</li> </ul> <p>What was the Frame of Government? <i>The Frame of Government was the colony's first constitution, which provided for a deputy governor and an elected legislature.</i></p> <p>What name did the Indians give to Penn as a way to honor his kindness to them? <i>The Indians gave Penn the name "Onas," which means "feather."</i></p>	<p>Where did William Penn establish a new colony? <i>In Pennsylvania, near other British colonies in North America</i></p> <p>Describe the land in which the new colony was established. How did this land contribute to the colony's name? <i>The land was heavily wooded. From this landscape, the colony received the name "Pennsylvania," which means, "Penn's woods."</i></p>	<p>When did Penn and the Quakers sail to create their new colony? <i>In 1681, Penn and three ships filled with Quaker settlers traveled to America.</i></p> <p>The Quakers made a treaty with the Delaware Indians. How long did this treaty last? <i>This treaty, which established peace between the Indians and settlers based on the understanding that they were equal before God, was the only treaty between settlers and Indians never to be broken.</i></p>	<p>Why did Penn desire to establish a colony? <i>Penn desired to establish a colony in America so that Quakers could freely practice their religion in peace.</i></p> <p>List two reasons Quakers were persecuted in England. Any two of these would be correct:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Believed it was wrong to fight; refused to fight for the king</li> <li>Refused to support the Church of England by paying taxes</li> <li>Gave their allegiance to God alone, although the people of England were expected to swear loyalty to the king</li> <li>Believed all men are equal, which went against the established way of thinking</li> </ul>
