

TRUE OR FALSE?

Your student has been instructed to write T (for True) or F (for False) in the space provided. We have provided correct answers below the false questions. You may conduct this quiz orally, if you prefer.

- <u>*T*</u> The long, wooden-framed dwellings in which family groups of the Iroquois lived were called longhouses.
- *F* The Mohawks were an Iroquois tribe allied with the French, but an enemy of the Iroquois League. *False. The Hurons were allied with the French but an enemy of the Iroquois League.*
- <u>*T*</u> The Iroquois League was originally a group of five Iroquois Indian nations (the Seneca, Cayuya, Onondaga, Oneida, and Mohawk tribes) that together formed a government to provide strength, protection, and peaceful relations with one another.
- <u>*T*</u> The families of Iroquois who lived together were called clans, and each clan was designated with an animal name such as Bear, Hawk, or Wolf.
- *F* The "Three Sisters" are what the Iroquois called the rain, snow, and clouds. *False. The "Three Sisters" were the three types of crop (corn, beans, and squash) that the Iroquois planted in fields surrounding their villages.*
- *F* The Iroquois used metal to make canoes, which they used to fish in rivers and lakes. *False. The Iroquois made canoes from elm bark.*
- *F* Sachem is the name of the white and purple beads fashioned into belts that were used for recording such things as agreements and treaties. *False. The name for these beads is* wampum.
- <u>*T*</u> Buckskin is tanned deerskin used to make clothing such as blouses, leggings, and moccasins.
- ____ The tribal leader of the Iroquois was called a king. False. The tribal leader was called a sachem.
- <u>*T*</u> The Iroquois revered the Great Spirit, whom they believed created the world.
