Iroquois Confederacy A group of people who disagreed with the rules of the Church of England and separated themselves in order to worship and follow God according to their understanding of the Bible

Able leader whose hunting and trading skills helped the Jamestown settlement to survive

Long, wooden-framed dwellings in which family groups of the Iroquois lived

A religious group of people also known as "Friends" or the "Society of Friends"

A young Powhatan princess instrumental in helping the Jamestown colony; later married a colonist and became a Christian

A name referring to trade between three ports: Europe, Africa, and the West Indies. Along the trading route, abducted Africans were exchanged for cargo and then sold as slaves.

The Native American who befriended the Pilgrims and helped them survive at Plymouth

The Dutch governor of the New Netherland colony; also known as "Old Silvernails"

Originally a group of five Iroquois nations (the Seneca, Cayuga, Onondaga, Oneida, and Mohawk tribes, later joined by the Tuscarora tribe) that together formed a government to provide strength, protection, and peaceful relations with one another

A courageous and determined French explorer who searched for new trade routes and fur trading settlements; considered the "Father of New France"

Craftspeople of the colonial era with a variety of skills such as shoemaking, cabinetmaking, and papermaking

A document of governing laws for the people of the Plymouth settlement

A Puritan minister who founded Providence, the capital of the colony of Rhode Island

A large, self-sufficient farming estate for growing tobacco prevalent in the southern colonies

A Quaker leader who desired for his fellow Quakers to practice their ideas and faith in peace; established the colony of Pennsylvania.
