Week 1 -Year 2 Twilight of the Western Roman Empire

This is the first week of Unit 1: Middle Ages. The Middle Ages are the years of European history between two other ages: the Ancient (or Classical) period and the Modern one. Thus, this name was given to the years between the fall of the Roman Empire and the start of the period which we saw both the Protestant Reformation and the Age of Exploration. In terms of dates, the Middle Ages fall between the early 400's and the late 1500's.

If you have not done so already, you will need to take time this week to set up notebooks and learn procedures that are unique to your family's implementation of Tapestry of Grace studies. Your Mom will guide you in this process, using the set-up document on the Loom.

In terms of historical content, all but the youngest students will review information they learned at the end of last year's study of the ancient world. Whether you study the ancient world with Tapestry or with another program, you will want to remember some important details from the close of last year's studies.
